CITY COUNCIL MEETING
SUMMARY OF MINUTES
MONDAY, APRIL 15th, 2019
7:00 P.M.**

MAYOR WELLS-ARMSTRONG: I would like to call the meeting to order. We will start with a prayer by Pastor Stephanie Hutton from River City Church South and go on to the pledge of allegiance by the City Council.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

ROBERT ELLINGTON SNIPES: I was here before. I need to know who authorized the removal of the tent from my property. It is amazing that no one seems to know. There is no way you can convince me that an organized City...Not just the tents but the lions, BBQ Grill and everything that was in the tent that you had no authority to do. We are at the Supreme Court level now...I filed the petition today. The first thing I would do is contact department heads to get an answer. There has never been a tenet permit issued...now they will have...I am asking you to figure it out who took all of my property off of my property. I am a tax paying citizen and also a United States citizen and there is a such thing as a right to privacy...if we have to go to Federal Court we will. You have no right to do what you did and file paperwork kind of like fraudulently. Who gave the authority? No one seems to know. I had to send stuff all the way to Evergreen Park...we are going to fight it until the end no matter of the cost and win this particular case. Who took the stuff off my property?

LANCE MARZAK: For five months I have been talking about the bike lane project and the dangers of this road and how removing existing parking will impact businesses. The barricades where placed this weekend and it says no parking. Older customers were not there this weekend. Saturday night, a pedestrian was hit in front on No Dawgs. What will it take...better options...the greatest of leaders take-action.

JUDGE CUNNINGTON: I was a City Alderman for the 6th Ward from 1983-2000. I was seatmates with Alderman Baron. I voted for Dennis eight times. I want to say Thank you for your service on behalf of the citizens of the 6th Ward and all Citizens in

Kankakee. We are better off as a community due to your service, professionalism and your work here at City Hall. I also received a call from Don Green, he was not able to make it and he asked that I read this letter for the record. ~I am sorry I am unable to attend the Council meeting and give remarks about Dennis' long and valuable service to the citizens of Kankakee. I had the pleasure of working closely with Dennis as an Alderman for four years then as a Mayor for 16 years. When I took office in 1993 one of the first things I faced was a city deeply in debt with a poor bond rating. Despite the daunting challenges, Dennis said yes when I asked him to chair the budget committee. With the help of the other Alderman and a blue-ribbon panel of business leaders, we were able to erase the debt and develop balanced budgets and obtain an A+ Bond Rating all continued through Mayor Epstein's tenure. Dennis played a major role as Chairman of the budget committee establishing a highly successful bus system now serving the Kankakee area. In all the years Dennis has been on the City Council, I have never known him to grandstand, seek recognition, or treat anyone disrespectfully. There is no question that Dennis is a man of integrity who has worked diligently to improve the quality of life in Kankakee. Kay and I thank him for his deep and genuine commitment for the community. ITEM 9A: Public Safety-Alderman Osenga. The meeting was held on Tuesday, March 5th, 2019...highlights include: the bills were paid totaling a little over \$30,000.00. Overtime is on budget for the month of February. There is one Officer off injured at this time. Over 200 traffic tickets written...97 tickets for vehicles with no city stickers.

ITEM 9B: Public Safety-Alderman Osenga. The meeting was held on Tuesday, April 2nd, 2019...highlights include: a large amount of bills was paid approximately \$328,000.00 but there were 4 months of KanComm bills contributing to the amount.

ITEM 9C: Ordinance-Alderman Tall. The meeting was held on Tuesday, March 26th, 2019...highlights include: we passed the ordinance last meeting for the sewer rate increase. We discussed establishing liquor license under Class J which would be...license...we are still in discussion on this topic.

ITEM 9D: Economic Development-Alderman Tetter. The meeting was held on Thursday, March 28, 2019...highlights include several discussions. Mainly, the Committee wishes to be informed by the Capital Team. For Example: the property that was sold to Auto Lab, how that came about...account...mailouts to local residents

MAYOR WELLS-ARMSTRONG: In hearing the feedback, it may be good for a member of the Capital Team to attend the Economic Development Committee meetings. We will make those adjustments.

ITEM 9E: Budget-Alderman Baron. The meeting was held on

Additional Home Rule Sale Tax which is a separate amount of money we have taxed devoted to the pensions.
Revenues over \$400,000.00 are not exact but close to our projection. The Health Insurance quote for next year has decreased 3.5 percent compared to Union Contracts with a 2 percent increase...we are headed in the right direction.

ITEM 9F:

Budget-Alderman Baron. The meeting was held on Monday, April 8th, 2019...highlights include: We went through 11 months same as 91.7 percent of the year. We had utilization for expenditures of 91.62 percent for the year. Home Rule Tax over \$432,000.00...we had a discussion on how do we pay additional Home Rule Tax to the Pension Fund. The consensus was every 6 months. The first draft of the Executive Summary will be available May 2019 and we will need a continuing to spend Resolution 2018/2019 fiscal year budget.

The following jumped up...a long time ago when I was a youngish Alderman some would constituents approached me with their concerns about Halloween and their reluctance to open their homes to Trick-or-Treaters.
